We explored these with the help of Roberta Longfellow, Montgomery County Housing & Homeless Solutions Administrator and The Reverend Judith Barr, Director of the Samaritan Homeless Clinic.

The second annual Cookie Walk was again a huge success – raising \$2086.00 for mission – and we had a great and delicious time in the process.
