Two short documentaries produced by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance about immigration detention and refugee resettlement...”**Locked in a Box**” and “**To Breathe Free**” inspired several members of Westminster to seek an avenue to share them with our community to increase awareness about these timely issues. The result is the **Peace Literacy-Dayton Film Forum** which is being hosted by the **21st Century Peace Literacy Foundation**. We are very pleased to be a part of an even larger program in Dayton, led by the Dayton Performing Arts Alliance, called “**Building Peace through the Arts.**”

The first screening on **Monday Oct. 2 at 7 pm** will take place at the new **Goodwill/ Easter Seals building at 660 S. Main Street** - close to Miami Valley Hospital. There is ample free parking there. We hope many of you can join us that evening for refreshments, film viewing and dialogue afterwards. (The combined run time of both films is only 46 minutes.)

On **Tuesday, Oct. 3 at 7 pm** the films screened at the **Fazl-I-Umar Mosque, Ahmadiyya Muslim Community at 637 Randolph Street, Dayton 45417**. This will be a great opportunity to dialogue with our Muslim friends and others regarding immigration and the refugee crisis in Syria. The filmmaker will be in attendance.

On **Wednesday, Oct. 4 at 5:30 pm - Sinclair CC - Building 7, Room 7** (near the Tartan Cafe) “Locked in a Box” film will be shown, followed by conversation with the film maker, David Barnhart and a panel of SCC professors and staff members.

On **Friday, Oct. 6th at 7 pm** - we will be screening both films **Westminster, 125 N. Wilkinson St. Dayton**, followed by a panel discussion including the filmmaker, David Barnhart, Susan Krehbiel -Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Catalyst for Immigration and Refugees, as well as others with first hand experience in the area of immigration and refugee resettlement.
