

## ADULT EDUCATION

### New Adult Education Classes Begin Today 11:20 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.

*Creationism vs. Mainstream Science (and History)*, (Room 209-211). Bill and Sue Trollinger, professors at University of Dayton, will teach this six-week course. Having taught previously at Westminster, participants will know how knowledgeable and approachable both are as they teach this class. The topic for January 13 is "The Varieties of Creationism" and for January 20, it will be "The Rhetoric of Creationism vs. Mainstream Science."

**BOUNDARIES: When to Say YES, When to Say NO, To Take Control of Your Life**, (Chapel). Dawn Poindexter, a Licensed Professional Counselor with a Master of Science: Clinical Mental Health Counseling degree, will teach this six-week biblical-inspired course developed by Dr. Henry Cloud and Dr. John Townsend. A few of the common questions to be addressed in class: What are legitimate boundaries? Can I set limits and still be a loving person? What if someone is upset or hurt by my boundaries? How do I answer someone who wants my time, love, energy, or money? Why do I feel guilty or afraid when I consider setting boundaries? Each week contains video segments by Dr. Cloud and Dr. Townsend along with class discussions.

**Mocking Evil While Still Taking It Seriously**—Richard Baker (West Parlor). "The devil . . . that proud spirit, cannot endure to be mocked." So said Thomas More. And laughing the devil can be a good strategy: it can expose his pretentiousness for what it is. At the same time, evil's grip on our world, our lives, and yes, our hearts can be—and is—terrifying. In this class, we'll look at attempts to understand evil, insofar as it can be understood, as well as imaginative attempts to depict it in literature and art. The class will be held on January 13 and 27, and February 3, 10, and 17.

## INFANTS AND CHILDREN

**Infants and Toddlers** (Infant - 4 years old) are cared for from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Room 108. Parents of infants are provided a beeper by the nursery staff in case immediate communication is needed while they worship in the Sanctuary. During the worship hour, they take part in an activity and enjoy a snack.

**We welcome young children to worship in our Sanctuary** at Westminster today with cloth worship bags freshly stocked with new quiet, worship-related activities, including a Children's Bulletin and felt board designed specifically for today's service. Not all bags are the same! Next week, your child will likely find a different, new activity inside his or her bag. The bags can be found in a basket on a bench in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and upstairs in the balcony. All children are invited to use one throughout the worship time and then return the bag to its original location, taking the papers home with them.

**Pre-K and Kindergartners** are invited to **Children and Worship**, a unique and interactive introduction to the stories and practices of our faith. As the second hymn begins, these children will be met in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and escorted to Room 102. Children and Worship concludes at 11:30 a.m. From there, children will be escorted to Genesis Singers (Pre-K) in Room 104 and Cherub Choir (K) in the Theater. Children not attending choir need to be met by their parents at 11:30 a.m.

Children in **grades 1 and 2** are invited to attend **Come and See/Godly Play**, a unique and interactive worship experience for younger elementary children. As the second hymn begins, these children will be met in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and escorted to Room 104. From there, they will be led by their shepherds to their CrossRoads workshops at 10:55 a.m.

**CrossRoads: Education for the Journey** features varied and engaging activities for children in **first through sixth grade**, 10:55-11:30 a.m. "Worship," a new three-week workshop begins today. As the final hymn begins, children are invited to meet their age-group shepherds in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and be escorted to their workshops. Choir children will be escorted directly to their rehearsals. Other children may be picked up from their workshops at 11:30 a.m. Workshop location signs are posted in the Narthex and on the stage in Fellowship Hall.
