Today we celebrate the Day of Pentecost. According to the Day of Pentecost story in Acts 2:1-21, God gave the gift of the Holy Spirit to empower witnesses to the resurrection. Sounds from heaven, cosmic language, the rush of a mighty wind invaded the house in which the apostles gathered and appeared to them as a burning fire. Tongues of fire moved among them and gripped them. This is the day we celebrate the coming of God's Spirit among the first apostles and among us. Pentecost is a communal experience. It has to do with the transformation, the renewal, and the imparting of the Spirit to the community of faith, the Church.

Today's Music: Today we once again sing "Lord, Keep Us Steadfast in Your Word." The text is by Martin Luther and translated by Catherine Winkworth (1827-1878). When the Turkish army had overrun Hungary and was threatening Germany in 1541, Luther wrote and used this hymn in a special prayer service asking for God's protection. Original references to the Pope and the Turks were later omitted to make the hymn more generally useful. The Word of God was always uppermost in the mind of Luther, and we sing his prayer asking God to keep us faithful to the Word.

There are some hymns that mention the person and work of the Holy Spirit but few speak of Pentecost event as "the birthday of the church." "On Pentecost They Gathered" (Hymn 128) contains several direct references to Pentecost from the second chapter of Acts. It ends with the hope that the singular event which inspired the disciples to "turn the world upside down" (Acts 17:6) will move modern-day Christians to do the same.

The procession this morning, led by Danielle Potter, offers a symbolic reminder of the Holy Spirit. The dove is a reminder of the Spirit's presence.

INFANTS AND CHILDREN

Infants and Toddlers (Infant - 4 years old) are cared for from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. in Room 108. Parents of infants are provided a beeper by the nursery staff in case immediate communication is needed while they worship in the Sanctuary. During the worship hour, the older toddlers participate in a faith formation class, First Lessons in Faith, take part in an activity, and enjoy a snack.

Pre-K and Kindergarteners are invited to **Children and Worship**, a unique and interactive introduction to the stories and practices of our faith. As the second hymn begins, these children will be met in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and escorted to Room 106. Children and Worship concludes at 11:30 a.m. From there, children will be escorted to Genesis Singers (Pre-K) in Room 104 and Cherub Choir (K) in the Theater. Children not attending choir need to be met by their parents at 11:30 a.m.

Children in **grades 1 and 2** are invited to attend **Come and See/Godly Play**, a unique and interactive worship experience for younger elementary children. As the second hymn begins, these children will be met in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and escorted to Room 104. From there, they will be led by their shepherds to their CrossRoads workshops at 10:55 a.m.

CrossRoads: Education for the Journey features varied and engaging activities for children in **first through sixth grade**, 10:55-11:30 a.m. As the final hymn begins, children are invited to meet their age-group shepherds in the Narthex (main Sanctuary entrance) and be escorted to their workshops. See signs in the west end of the Narthex and on the Fellowship Hall stage. Choir children will be escorted directly to their rehearsals. Other children may be picked up from their workshops at 11:30 a.m.
